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## STARTING THE SCHOOL YEAR

**Busing:** Reminder for Manchester residents that there is NO SCHOOL BUS available next week! MSD starts on the 6<sup>th</sup>. We hope that we have route information to give you before then. Please be patient as they are likely still dealing with driver shortages.

**Orientation:** We hope that you all had an opportunity to Zoom with Mr. Tuttle this week during your orientation session. Here are some of the topics that were covered; this is not all inclusive so please reach out to each other or to us if you need clarification.

Drop off & pickup is in the upper parking ONLY. Please do not drive through the crosswalk!!!



Early dismissal requires an email in advance from a parent or guardian AND if the student is not a driver, the adult picking them up MUST COME IN and sign out their student. Please use <a href="mailto:attendance@sparkacademynh.org">attendance@sparkacademynh.org</a> to report absences and early dismissals.

Fourth year students do NOT need to sign in at Spark at 8:00 AM unless they have a college class at 8:00 AM. They must sign in at Spark before their first college class of the day.

We will assign all students a 15" school laptop for school use. If you plan to bring it home, you will need a bag or backpack with a padded compartment.

There will be NO PERSONAL ELECTRONICS allowed in Spark classrooms except during the midday break. Students may use their phones during that time to text or respond to texts from parents. Any phone calls must go through the front desk. Phones should be secured in lockers at all times except during the midday break. Please do



not bring tablets, laptops, gaming units, or any other unnecessary personal electronic items to school. THIRD AND FOURTH YEAR STUDENTS are expected to follow Spark guidelines while in Spark classrooms and college guidelines while in college classrooms.

Wireless listening devices ARE NOT ALLOWED at Spark. Wired devices may be utilized in the classroom at the teacher's discretion only.

We have a dress code and expect all students to follow it. Please refer



to the handbook for guidelines if you are unsure. Safety in labs and a professional presentation are the goals of our school dress code.

Students MAY NOT have food delivered for lunch. Bagged lunches and refillable water bottles with lids should be utilized. We have refrigerators and microwaves for student use. If a student forgets their lunch, we will provide them with something to eat. Please do not bring in hot takeout food for your student if they forget their lunch! Spark students who are also MCC students (i.e., taking college classes) may eat in the cafeteria. They should NOT bring cafeteria food to Spark classrooms to eat.
