FROM THE GUIDANCE OFFICE

SAT and PSAT information:

FOURTH-YEARS:

We are administering the SAT on Thursday, October 26th. All students are encouraged to attend; it provides us with longitudinal data. Please email Mrs. Minery if you will not be there. The test is approximately 4 hours. We will start as



close to 8am as possible, so plan on getting to the school by 7:45. Anyone who arrives after the timed section starts will not be permitted in the classroom. There is no make-up date.

THIRD-YEARS:

Third-year students are required to take the PSAT/NMSQT on Thursday, October 26th. As juniors they are eligible for qualifying for the [National Merit Scholarship](#). Students who have a college class are encouraged to work with their college instructor about making up work. Since this test is digital, **all students are expected to bring in their computer and charging cord on Wednesday, October 25th and will leave them at the school that evening. If a student does not bring in their computer and charging cord, there will be a call home for this material.** The test is approximately 3.5 hours. We will start as close to 8am as possible, so plan on getting to the school no later than 7:45. Anyone who arrives after the timed section starts will not be permitted in the classroom. There is no make-up date.



SECOND-YEARS:

Second-year students are required to take the PSAT/NMSQT on Thursday, October 26th. **Since this test is digital, all students are expected to bring in their computer and charging cord on Wednesday, October 25th and will leave them at the school that evening. If a student does not bring in their computer and charging cord, there will be a call home for this material.** The test is approximately 3.5 hours. We will start as close to 8am as possible, so plan on getting to the school no later than 7:45. Anyone who arrives after the timed section starts will not be permitted in the classroom. There is no make-up date.

First-year students are required to take the PSAT 8/9 on Thursday, October 26th. **Since this test is digital, all students are expected to bring in their computer and charging cord on Wednesday, October 25th and will leave them at the school that evening. If a student does not bring in their computer and charging cord, there will be a call home for this material.** The test is approximately 3.25 hours. We will start as close to 8am as possible, so plan on getting to the school no later than 7:45. Anyone who arrives after the timed section starts will not be permitted in the classroom. There is no make-up date.

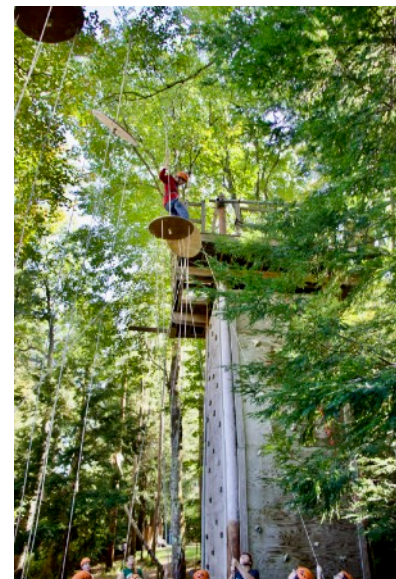
