FROM THE GUIDANCE OFFICE...

One of the advantages of Spark Academy is the proximity to Manchester Community College and the opportunity our students have to take classes that could lead to a career pathway. In an effort to expose the students to what MCC offers, guests were generous with their time and met with members of the DaVinci cohort this week.

On Monday Peter La Monica, the Department Head of the Computer Science program, shared about the *Cloud Services IT*, the *Computer and Science Innovation*, and the *Cybersecurity Investigations* programs. A number of our students indicated that they were interested in at least one of the programs, and he invited them to check out the technology in the computer labs.

In the fall, all Spark students took a tour of MCC's state-of-the-art Heating,

Ventilation, & Air Conditioning facilities. On Tuesday, Eddie Curran, the Department Head, took it a step further by coming to DaVinci's classroom and explaining more about the program and the job security involved in a career in the HVAC field. By the end of the discussion a few of the students seemed pretty excited.

On Thursday, Colleen Jennings of the English, Humanities and Language Department informed DaVinci of the many programs that could be available to them. *College Composition* is a requirement for any of the Associate Degree programs, as well as a prerequisite for many of MCC's Social Science and Behavioral

Science programs. Our goal is that our students will be ready for this college-level writing course by their fourth year.
