Standardized Testing

This year students will take the AIR SAS test for math, reading, writing, and science. Additionally, students will be taking the PSAT and SAT tests for math, reading, and writing. Throughout the school year, students will be working with practice materials to prepare for these assessments.

The following is a list of the testing dates:

6th grade SAS (math, reading, and writing) March 25, 2020

7th grade SAS (math, reading, and writing) April 3, 2020

8th grade SAS (math, reading, and writing) April 17, 2020

8th and 11th grade SAS (science) Date TBD

9th and 11th grade PSAT October 30, 2019

11th grade SAT March 25, 2020

8th and 9th grade PSAT March 25, 2020






