We are hoping to begin our involvement in the MCC-sponsored *No Sew Blanket Project* this Wednesday, 1/29, as our way of helping provide kids at local hospitals with warm blankets as a means of helping address a need that many of us seldom think of. In Manchester alone, it is estimated at 450 kids sleep without beds and are in need of blankets to help keep them warm though the night.

This is an ongoing project which will provide the Spark community

The Sleep in Heavily Peace Project 2/12 & 2/13, will provide us with another opportunity to help those less fortunate than we by helping provide simple beds for kids from ages 3-17 in the Manchester area. It is estimated that 2-3% of kids nationally lack for beds to sleep in. The 450 Manchester kids mentioned previously also need beds. Our students will help with all aspects of bed building — from cutting, sanding, drilling, assembling, and staining simple, but much needed beds for kids. There are fewer ways to create empathy for our fellow human beings and to helps us appreciate the good which we are capable of than by rolling up our sleeves and making a difference together!

Finally, please note the various dates in the box at the beginning of our newsletter. Our students will be off on Tuesday, 2/11 (Primary Election Day), while the Spark Staff works on planning for the future.
