As we complete our first week of all in-person instruction, I want to thank all of you for working as thoughtfully as you have. An important element of teaching is the sense we get from a student's body language, tone of voice, and facial expressions to "see" when our students are "getting it." That is difficult to do remotely, especially with a program such as ours that features so much hands-on learning.

This decision certainly rests with our families, but I strongly urge every student to attend their Spark classes inperson if possible. We are proceeding with the utmost care to provide a safe environment for everyone in our school because we truly care about each member of our school community. Information regarding these two standardized tests was provided in last week's newsletter. Therefore, I will impose on you to read that material again. However, we do have a few points of information to add.

- Students should get a good night's sleep.
