As we prepare to welcome our students to or back to Spark, I must inform you of the decision made yesterday at Manchester Community College regarding COVID precautions. Spark Academy will need to comply with these measures. Those of you who have been with us for the past two years know that we appear not to have experienced any cases of COVID among the Spark Community. If we apply the level of diligence we did throughout the past year, I feel confident that we will be able to continue that record. Let's continue to work well together to get to the other side of this situation.

As of now, we have no plans to screen students as they enter the building but ask that you self-screen at home with respect to COVID symptoms. It is always wise to stay home whenever we feel ill so as not to spread any illness. As we are a high school and can depend on a certain level of mature and responsible behavior from everyone at Spark, we do not face the challenges that elementary schools do. For that, we can be grateful. I ask for everyone's patience and very much look forward to the time when we can speak of all this in the past tense.

Here is the message from Dr. Bicknell, President of MCC...

Hello Everyone,

Unfortunately, the community transmission rates for COVID have increased from Substantial to High. Transmission levels increased to High yesterday and remained at the High level today, so we don't look at this as a one-day blip, but something that will continue for a period of time. Therefore, following our protocol, we need to increase our safety measures. *Effective immediately, (August 26, 2021), masks must be worn at all times inside all MCC buildings, except when alone in private offices.* 

Many of us are out of the habit of wearing masks at all times, so please be patient with others as we make the transition. There are masks available throughout the building, in classrooms, many office suites and at the front desk.

We will continue to monitor community transmission. Following our protocols, when community transmission decreases back to Substantial for two weeks, we will revert back to masks being optional except in classrooms, and when social distancing cannot be maintained.

Thank you for your cooperation as we work together to fight back against COVID.
