The VEX Robotics NH/VT State Championship made for a really exciting two days last weekend! We would also like to thank every member of the Spark community who spent time volunteering at the event, sent in food, and/or showed up to cheer for the Spark Robotics Team on Saturday. We had a terrific showing, with all five teams advancing as far as the Quarterfinal round and TWO teams earning spots at the World Championship! The Bickering Badgers (77275B) got all the way to the Finals, where they lost to their fellow Spark team members but advanced to Worlds with a top five Skills score. They also won the Amaze award.

Team Axon (77275A) won Tournament Champion, earned the top Skills score, and won the Excellence Award. They will also be going to Worlds!

Huge congratulations to both of these hardworking fourth-year teams.
